A PERFECT FAMILY DAY AT ALISAL RANCH




01. EARLY MORNING





A Fresh Look WITHANODTO THE PAST

ALISAL RANCH'S ROOM RENOVATIONS MARRY HISTORY AND MODERNITY



From cowboys to Hollywood legends, Alisal Ranch's storied history is cherished. But every top resort needs a refresh every now and then. The question is, how do you design for a simple life, well-lived? If you're Alisal Ranch, you call in longtime design partner, Taylor House Interiors.

Remodeling and redecorating over 70 rooms and bathrooms while the resort remains open is no small feat, but Jennifer Taylor was up to the task. "Our first task was to create more comfortable rooms for our guests," she explains.

Taylor and her team thoughtfully considered today's travelers' needs, quickly realizing additional, versatile sleeping options for our guests was priority number one. "One of the most notable changes was the addition of queen-sized sleeper sofas and custom Murphy beds," she says. "These add double bunk or twin beds where a rollaway used to be the only option. They are simple to use and can be stowed away during the day!"

Design-wise, Taylor wanted to maintain a connection between elements of the original California-Western aesthetic while pursuing an updated look. "We focused on warmth and Western-inspired, with materials like leather, cowhides, exposed wood paneling, and wrought iron. We also used traditional Pendleton, Ralph Lauren, and Kravet fabrics."

Historic renovations often have a bit of a treasure hunt feel about them, and Alisal Ranch's room renovations didn't disappoint. "Over the course of our remodel we found countless vintage cowboy and western decor items such as tack, cowhides, photographs, original art-even chaps," she says. Displaying these pieces celebrates the ranching lifestyle and regional history; something that was important to both Taylor and the Ranch. "Some things we wanted to keep, such as the original ranch oak furniture from the 1940s and historical sepia photographs."

It may not have been easy, but open the door to your guestroom and it's clear the hard work of bridging old and new was well worth it. Chic and updated, there is a distinct nod to history and a clear sense of place, just with an updated twist. "We wanted to honor old memories while inviting new guests to make new memories," says Taylor. "Ultimately, we hope the guests find a comfortable cottage filled with western warmth and hospitality. A space that seamlessly blends with the stunning colors of those surrounding the ranch, and a place they can relax and take the time to enjoy a setting like no other. It's not fancy pants, but it's perfect for dusty pants."




Imeworn... with a Twist

It began with bins and bins of dusty, old blankets. Of course, these weren't just any old blankets; they were Pendleton blankets, the American heritage brand synonymous with the American West. Now relegated to storage, these luxury blankets once graced the beds in Alisal Ranch's guestrooms. Some were frayed or faded but the beauty and history were unmistakable—and worth saving.

The team at Alisal Ranch knew they deserved a new lease on life, but were unsure how to revitalize them. That's when they turned to Santa Barbara-based furniture designer, Joanna Beatrice Shultz. "This project was cool for me personally," says the highly creative Shultz. "Instead of donating or discarding them, Alisal came to me and we found a purposeful way to reuse them," she explains.

She transformed the big, heavy blankets into decorative bed throws, now seen on every bed at the Ranch. It wasn't an easy task, and Shultz was meticulous in her process and design. "The blankets were vintage, so I needed to handle them with care and also had to make sure that the colors and pattern lined up."







Indeed, this project was tailor made for Shultz, who is best known for her free-spirited, funky design. The Solvang native studied interior design in San Francisco before heading east to High Point, North Carolina to master upholstery and furniture design. Fiercely passionate, she plans to turn the furniture industry on its head. "I want people to see furniture differently. It's art."

Like the Pendleton blankets, Shultz's designs are all about repurposing and rethinking ordinary, everyday items. Case in point? A dumpster sofa she originally designed for herself for her 30th birthday. Stylish, irreverent, and just plain fun, it's a conversation starter, and unlike anything you can find anywhere else. A washing machine chair is in her future. "This is what I dream of – to make art through furniture," she says. "I have way more up my sleeve."

A SENSE OF PLACE— ON THE PLATE

Executive Chef Erik Sandven isn't just making breakfast, lunch, or dinner. He's creating a sense of place—with food.

"This area is like a playground for a chef," he says.

"Everything you need is right here!"

"Moving to Alisal Ranch was one of the best moves I could have made," he explains. Sandven earned his chops working at luxury resorts, including The Ritz-Carlton, Laguna Niguel, The Resort at Pelican Hill, and The Ritz-Carlton, Bacara before joining Alisal Ranch's kitchen in 2023.

Chef Sandven is charmed by the classics at Alisal Ranch. "We'll always have those favorites like chicken fried steak or the tortilla soup," he says. "We're elevating (but not eliminating) things," he explains. "I want our guests to experience the Santa Ynez Valley through our menu."

The Central Coast location is just one reason why Chef Sandven feels lucky to be here. "I've been working with local farmers and fishermen on sourcing," he says. "I'm often stopping on my way to work to pick up vegetables at local stands."

Building relationships with local farmers, winemakers, ranchers, and purveyors is important to him. It's why he's sourcing local, sustainable seafood like oysters, spiny lobsters, and rockfish from Stephanie Mutz of Sea Stephanie Fish. Roblar Winery and Folded Hill Farmstead are two other local favorites for produce and products. "At other hotels, my food was coming from a warehouse in LA, but here...it's amazing being so close to these fresh products. I love being able to play with these products that change with the seasons."

Local diver **Stephanie Mutz** spends her days in the nearby Channel Islands. On the ocean floor, rake in hand, she collects sea urchins one-by-one. Before putting any in her bag, she'll crack one open to check its quality and color. If it looks (and tastes!) good, she'll keep going.

Each urchin gets measured and – only if it's large enough – put in her bag for her customers. Working mostly with pre-orders, Stephanie knows roughly how many urchins she needs to bring back to shore each day. "I'm not catching as many as the average urchin diver would, but I believe in not wasting our natural resources," she says. A healthy environment, she explains, means biodiversity, or disrupting an area a little bit but not so much that it can't replace itself. Aside from the environmental benefits of her business model, she is able to guarantee the freshness of the urchins she delivers. Chefs and consumers purchase the urchins live and whole in the shell, and then can crack them and make delicious meals from them. "There's something about the cleanness in taste, and the fresh and clean finish with urchins directly out of the shell, so it's a pretty cool thing," Stephanie says.

While it's hard work, Stephanie knows one thing: "It's not boring, that's for sure!"

IT MAY NOT SEEM TYPICAL FOR SOMEONE LIKE BOWKER, WHO IS CURRENTLY RANKED #1 AMONG SHORT-STATURE ADAPTIVE GOLF PLAYERS IN THE UNITED STATES, BUT SPEND A FEW MINUTES WITH THE 20-SOMETHING AND YOU'LL SOON LEARN THAT NOTHING STANDS IN HIS WAY.



He started playing golf at the age of six with his grandfather, who cut one of his own clubs down to size for the young Chaz. The former naval captain suffered no fools and when Bowker took his first shot, sailing it squarely into his grandfather's shin, he thought it was over. "I remember him yelling, 'good shot!' I was hooked ever since."

Bowker now plays in a number of tournaments each year, including the Phoenix Cup. Similar to the Ryder Cup but with adaptive players, there are categories for vision-impaired, amputees, and Bowker's category, short stature.

"When I hit it good, it's just happiness," Bowker explains. But make no mistake. He's competitive-both on and off the course. "At the end of the day, not everyone can do this. I like to push my boundaries." He knows it's not every day that you get to meet a golfer like him with a four handicap. "Not a lot of people are used to seeing a player like me but then they watch me play, and they're amazed. It's proof that no matter your height—or anything—you can't let anything stop you."

GOLF AT ALISAL RANCH

Golf has been as synonymous with the Alisal Ranch experience as much as horseback riding. There are two courses: the 6,800-yard, par-72 River Course, a public course located along the Santa Ynez River, and The 6,550-yard, par-72 Ranch Course, originally opened in 1956 and is exclusively for our guests and club members. Designed by Billy Bell, Jr., it's characterized by its stunning setting and tight fairways.
